A Christ-centred Community: Jesus Christ in the Contemporary World

Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this Module, it is expected that participants will be able to:

1. Use sources accurately to describe the life and ministry of Jesus, and the understandings about him in the New Testament communities
2. Express, in simple terms, the divinity and the humanity of Jesus
3. Demonstrate a basic understanding of the Resurrection and its implications for our Christian lives as disciples
4. Articulate what it means to be a Christ-centred community
