





Student Code of Conduct


- The University of Divinity and Catholic Theological College are committed to provide its students, staff and visitors a safe learning space.







Safety


- CTC complies with the Safeguarding Policies of the Archdiocese of Melbourne and the University of Divinity

Leave of Absence

- A student who has been admitted to an award of the University of Divinity is entitled to a maximum of one year of leave of absence from the course of study for that award (Enrolment Policy 10.1).
- Leave of absence is a period in which a student remains enrolled in a course of study but does not undertake any study. Approved leave of absence is excluded when determining whether or not a student is within the maximum time permitted for completion of an award (Enrolment Policy 10.2).


